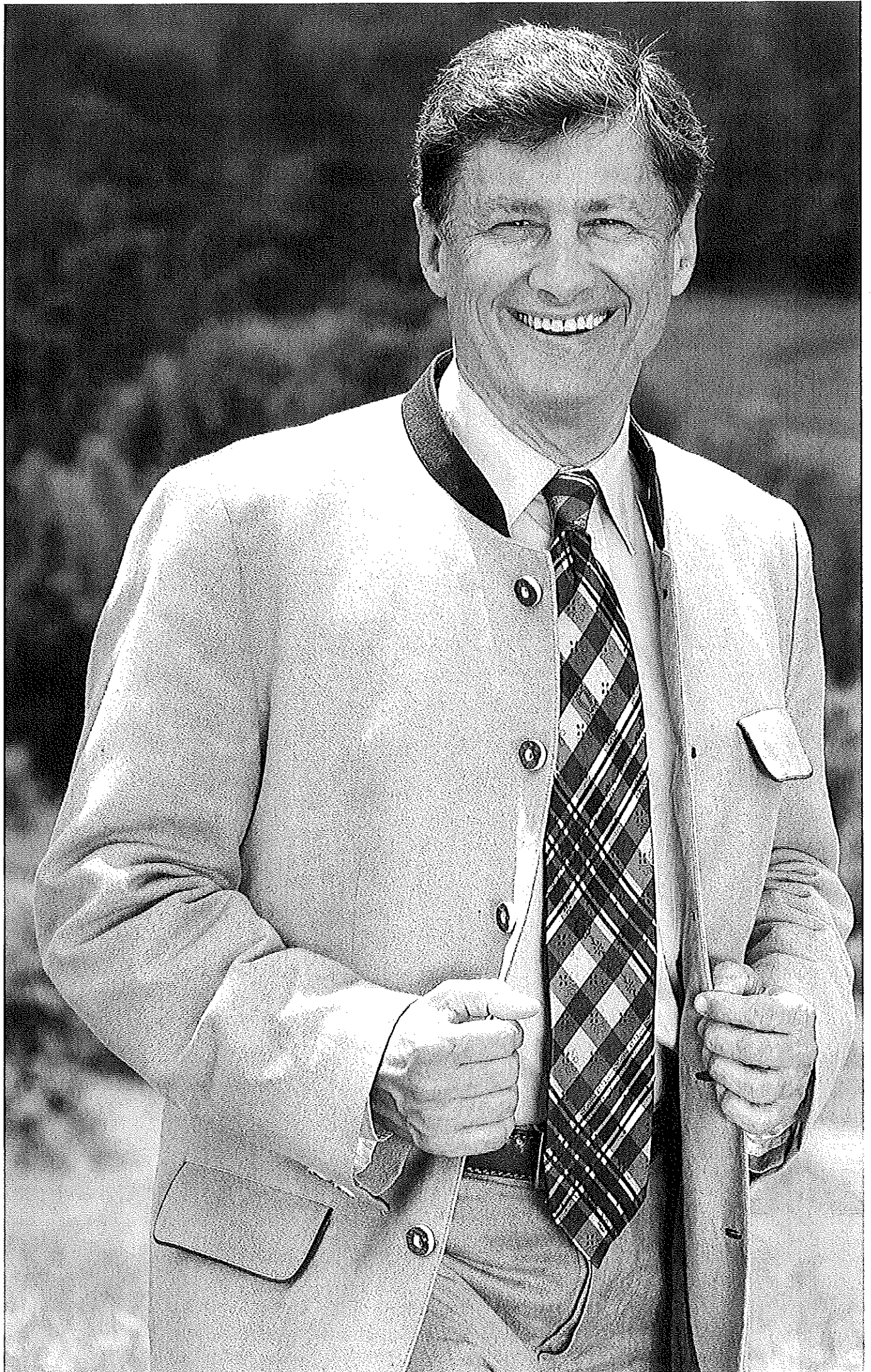

Marcello Raimondi, Minister for Environment, Energy and Networks of Lombardy Region, has been a member of the regional assembly since 2000. Holding a university degree in Philosophy, he is a journalist by profession and was appointed in the last legislature (2005-2010) Undersecretary to the President of Lombardy Region for Programme Implementation and one of the regional representatives to the Development Agreement and the Lombardy Table responsible for coordinating the events surrounding Expo 2015 in Milan. He is also a member of the Steering and Supervisory Committee of the Programme Agreement with the Chamber of Commerce network toward developing and increasing the competitiveness of the Lombard System, an agreement that includes regional policies to support to companies, research and innovation.

Dear Speakers,
I will be moderating the debate on "What future for the EU's air quality policy?" at the AIR conference on "The

challenge of air quality: a regional perspective" next Thursday, November 10, and thought it would be helpful to introduce myself in advance and give you an idea of how I plan to run our debate.

We want to have a lively and interactive debate in the very limited time available so, after a few introductory remarks (just 3-4 minutes) from Karl Falkenberg, the European Commission's Director-General for Environment, on how he sees the future of EU air quality policy, we will jump straight into the debate.

This means that instead of inviting you all to make opening statements, I will put a pre-agreed question to each of you, to which I will ask for brief replies of no more than two minutes each (this time discipline is essential if we are to leave time for some debate and interaction with Mr Falkenberg).

Based on the notes I have received from your offices, I have tried to identify one good question for each of you. I have also tried to link my questions to the content of the Memorandum of Understanding where possible and broadened some of the questions to ensure we address all the most important issues raised. Where you provided more than one suggested topic, I have chosen just one to try to ensure we hear views on a range of issues relating to air quality policy, but there will still inevitably be some overlap, with some of you wanting to address similar fairly broad themes in your opening questions, so I propose to group them as follows:

- The Memorandum of Understanding you are signing today calls for "better integration between EU policies affecting air quality". Why is this so important and what changes are needed to achieve this? Question to Emilia-Romagna, Lombardia

- The MoU also calls for the revised Directive to include "a degree of flexibility that allows the specific characteristics of our regions to be taken into account". Why is this important and how can the EU strike the right balance, giving you the flexibility you want without undermining the drive to achieve its overall goals? Question: Vlaanderen, Veneto

- What do you see as the highest priorities for action in the field of air quality management and what are the key issues which need to be addressed in the revised directive? Question to London and Randstad

- Who should do what to achieve the EU's air quality goals – i.e. what should be done at EU, national, regional and local level? Question to North Rhine-Westphalia Others of you have indicated you want to address more specific issues:

- Baden-Wurttemberg: The European Commission has emphasized the need to do more to tackle fine particles, but nitrogen dioxide emissions appear to be an even greater air quality problem in some areas. Is this true of your region, and if so, what should be done to accelerate progress?

- Catalunya: What role can/should fuel taxes play in helping to achieve the EU's air quality objectives?

- Hessen: the European Commission said in its Transport White Paper that "curbing mobility is not an option". How can highly-polluted cities meet the EU's limit values without restricting mobility to an unacceptable extent?

- Steiermark: Heating is a major challenge in relation to meeting the air quality standards set by the EU: why is this such a critical issue and how can it be best be addressed? Once you have all replied to these questions, I will give Mr Falkenberg to give him an opportunity to respond briefly to what has been said so far, and then follow up with some more questions from me to all of you. How many more questions I ask will, of course, depend on how much time is left and there will certainly not be time for everyone to answer every question, but I will try to ensure that you all get an opportunity to reply to at least one more. Obviously, the precise issues we discuss will depend on what has been said already, but questions we could explore in more detail include:

- The MoU highlights that there are still problems with some of the standards set by the Directive, particularly in your regions. What are the main obstacles to progress which need to be overcome?

- The MoU calls for EU instruments to "further assist regions in their efforts to improve air quality". What more can and should the EU do to help?

- If you had to identify just one priority for reform of the current air quality rules in the new directive, what would it be – i.e. what do you see as the most important issue to address?

I hope this note is helpful to prepare your interventions at the conference and look forward to meeting you all on 10 November.

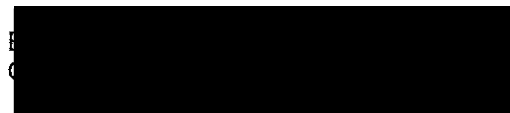
